What Are

S D G s ?

"SDGs" is the abbreviation for Sustainable Development Goals, which were adopted unanimously by 193 nations at the 2015 UN summit. The agenda consists of seventeen primary goals established that focus on three aspects of the world—economic, social, and environmental. The purpose of these goals is to create a society by the year 2030 that leaves no one behind.

With its overall ideal expressed as "Shinagawa—Balancing the Economy with the Environment," Shinagawa City is working on new economic, social, and environmental policies in a wide range of fields, and organizing programs designed to achieve the SDGs.



Some Programs Shinagawa City Conducts

Boosting the Number of Environment-Friendly ZEB-Certified Buildings

ZEB^{*1} refers to buildings designed to achieve zero annual energy consumption that also conserve and even generate energy while maintaining a comfortable indoor environment.

Shinagawa City is working on acquiring ZEB certification for city-owned buildings to increase the number of environment-friendly facilities. The city currently has the most ZEB-certified buildings^{*2} of all local governments in Japan.

Introducing a Mobility Support Vehicle—MaaS

Multitask vehicles called MaaS^{*3} have been introduced to assist residents who have difficulty coming to the City Office. These vehicles are equipped with support functions to handle My Number card application procedures, such as taking ID photos. The vehicle visits various places in the city.

The Deaflympics are held every four years for those with hearing disabilities. Working toward the 2025 Deaflympics in Tokyo, Shinagawa City is conducting various Deaf Sports Awareness events and support programs. The programs are meant to raise awareness of the attractive qualities of deaf sports and deepen understanding of people with hearing disabilities. They also have the overall goal of fostering an inclusive society where people respect and help each other.

Municipal Elementary and Junior High School Enrollment Procedures for Foreign Residents

Foreign residents of Shinagawa City who want to enroll their children in municipal elementary or junior high schools or compulsory education schools need to complete application procedures. Application forms will be mailed in late September to residents whose children are eligible for enrollment and who have completed resident registration. If you have not completed your resident registration but would like to enroll your children in these schools, please contact the city office.

Eligibility:

Elementary school/compulsory education school (primary education section)—Children born between April 2, 2017, and April 1, 2018

Junior high school/compulsory education school (secondary education section)—Children born between April 2, 2011, and April 1, 2012

School selection application period: October 1 (Sun.) through 31 (Tue.)

Health checkup: To be provided from November (scheduled) onward to children who will start the first grade of elementary school/compulsory education school in April, 2024.

● Concerning Vaccination Tickets

From Monday, September 4, vaccination tickets are gradually being mailed to those who have been vaccinated depending on the timing of the vaccination and age. If you have unused vaccination tickets, you can use them instead.

Please note that if you have lost your vaccination ticket or recently moved into Shinagawa City, you must complete application procedures.
