

Prepare for an earthquake!

Flow of evacuation in case of an earthquake



Explanation of evacuation sites, evacuation centers, evacuation facilities, etc.

● Temporary evacuation area

It is a familiar place where disaster prevention city resident organizations (town councils and neighborhood associations) can temporarily gather to check on each other and evacuate as a group. Make sure in advance where you will first run to in the event of an earthquake.

● Safety Evacuation area

It is an open space to evacuate temporarily at the time of an earthquake to protect yourself from the danger of the spread of fire. When there is a danger of fire, you need to evacuate to a nearby park, etc., but if there is a risk of fire spreading, make an early decision to escape to a wide-area evacuation site.

● Designated remaining area within the district

The area has been designed to be noncombustible, and there is no need to evacuate to a safety evacuation area.

● Evacuation road

These are roads designated by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government for the safe evacuation of people from areas where long-distance evacuation (more than 3 km) to wide-area evacuation sites is necessary in the event of an earthquake, or from areas where there is a significant risk of fire spread.

● Evacuation shelter for ward residents

It is a place to live temporarily when it is difficult to live at home due to collapsed houses, spread of fire, etc. The City decides to open the facility, and the evacuation center management committee will manage it. Facilities such as municipal schools are designated by each area. Check in advance which facilities you should go to. If the capacity is insufficient, a supplementary evacuation center will be established.

● Welfare evacuation shelter

The facility accepts pre-designated evacuees who have difficulty living with other evacuees in an evacuation center for city residents and who require support for evacuation activities.

● Tsunami evacuation facilities

A robust building made of reinforced concrete, etc., where local residents evacuate when a "tsunami warning" or "major tsunami warning" is announced. If you don't have time to evacuate to a high altitude place or tsunami evacuation facility, evacuate to the second floor or higher of the building.

Prepare for landslide disasters during wind and flood damage!

● Know the risk of landslide disasters

There are "landslide disaster warning area" and "landslide disaster special warning area" in the area where the damage of landslide disaster is expected. Both areas require caution, but the "landslide disaster special warning area" is a more dangerous area.

Sediment disaster warning area


Areas where there is a risk of endangering the lives or bodies of residents, etc.

Sediment disaster special warning area

Areas where there is a risk of damage to buildings and serious harm to the lives or bodies of residents, etc.

Landslide disaster warning information

While a heavy rain warning has been announced, this is jointly announced by the Japan Meteorological Agency and the Tokyo Metropolitan Government when there is an increased risk of a landslide disaster due to rainfall. This is a guideline for people living in areas where there is a risk of landslides to begin evacuation.



● When there is a risk of landslide disaster


Landslide disaster warning information can be checked on TV and the Japan Meteorological Agency website. In addition to making a decision on voluntary evacuation, evacuate to a safe place when evacuation information, etc. is announced or issued by the City.

Identify areas at risk of landslide disasters and confirm routes to evacuation sites in case of emergency.

Evacuation information and actions in case of wind and flood damage

Evacuation information is generally announced and issued as shown in the table below. Evacuation information is not always issued in this order. In addition, even if this information is not yet issued, if you feel it is dangerous, check the opening of evacuation centers, move to a Voluntary evacuation facility or evacuation area. If moving to an evacuation area poses a danger, evacuate to a safe place nearby or secure your safety inside a building.

Alert Level 5 Disaster occurrence/ Disaster impending	Emaergency safety Measures	A disaster has occurred or is imminent. Take immediate action to protect your life, such as emergency evacuation indoors (vertical evacuation, etc.).

Alert Level 4 Evacuation of all residents High risk of disaster	Evacuation Instruction	All persons should begin evacuating immediately to areas that will not be inundated.
Alert Level 3 Evacuation of the elderly, etc. Risk of disaster	Evacuation of the Elderly, Etc.	Elderly persons, etc. who need time to evacuate will begin evacuation. All others should prepare to evacuate.
Alert Level 2 Weather worsening	Advisory	Check the hazard map to confirm evacuation actions in case of a disaster.
Alert Level 1 Risk of weather worsening	Early advisory information (possibility of alarm level)	Increase preparedness for disasters by watching weather forecasts, etc.

Explanation of evacuation facilities and evacuation sites

● Voluntary evacuation facility

It is a facility for people who feel anxious about staying at home when a typhoon that causes damage to the City hits directly. According to the scale of the typhoon, etc., the City decides whether or not and when to open.

● Evacuation area

It is a place to receive evacuees temporarily to avoid danger when evacuation information, etc. is issued. Municipal schools are designated in advance, and the City decides to open in accordance with the announcement of evacuation information.

Evacuation areas are decided for each disaster of Meguro River flood, storm surge, Tama river flood, and landslide disaster.

Tips for evacuation

● Pay attention to the evacuation call and collect accurate information

When danger is approaching, the City or fire department may call for evacuation. If there is a call, evacuate immediately.

● Please cooperate in evacuating those who need consideration

There are people such as the elderly, the disabled, infants, and foreigners who need to pay attention to disasters. Be considerate and supportive.

● Equip with emergency supplies

Be prepared in advance so that when you evacuate, you can quickly take out the minimum necessary items.



Daily preparedness

In an emergency, you may not be able to get necessary things such as food at the time of evacuation.

You should prepare necessary items on a daily basis so that you can take them with you when you evacuate.



【Examples of emergency items】

■ Items that inform health conditions

- Helpmark/Helpcard
- Certificate of disability
- Medicine notebook

To receive assistance

■ Valuables, etc.

- Cash (including coins)
- Bankbook and seal
- House key
- Identification card (e.g. driver's license)
- Health insurance card
- A list of emergency contact information
- Cellular phones, smartphones, and battery chargers

■ Hygiene products

- Household medicines and medicines for everyday use
- Masks
- Wet wipes
- Towels
- Toothbrush
- Glasses and contact lenses (contact lens cleaning solution)
- Portable toilet
- Toilet paper
- First-aid kit



■ Convenience goods

- Flashlight
- Whistle and buzzer
- Helmet
- Working gloves
- Writing materials and notes
- Packing tape
- Plastic bag
- Slippers
- Portable radio

Disaster prevention memo for my family

Write and keep a disaster prevention memo of the decisions you have made with your family in case of a disaster. One way to do this is to take a picture of your emergency memo with your cellular phone or smartphone camera. Also, Shinagawa Disaster Prevention Pocket Card can be used to confirm necessary information such as the evacuation process. Carry it in your wallet on a daily basis for convenience in times of disaster.

Information gathering

At the time of a disaster, inaccurate rumors and unfounded information may flow. Ensure that you have up-to-date and correct information on the status of the disaster and the opening of evacuation centers and evacuation areas from reliable sources.

Cable TV Shinagawa

The Shinagawa City Resident Channel (terrestrial digital broadcasting channel 11) displays warning information and other information in text on the regular broadcast screen.

L-shaped broadcast

Displays weather information such as warnings and water level information of the Meguro and Tachiai Rivers.

Shinagawa TV-Push

A service that delivers emergency information by automatically switching channels or turning on the TV (paid service).

Yahoo! Disaster Prevention Alert

To use this service, regional setting is required in Shinagawa City, Tokyo



Shinagawa City distributes disaster prevention information and emergency information using the Yahoo! Disaster Prevention Alert.

FM radio



FM Shinagawa (88.9 MHz) provides information from the City and Disaster Prevention Administrative Radio.

Emergency only

Disaster prevention administrative radio confirmation dial

If you call 0120-562-311, you can listen to the content of the disaster prevention administrative radio broadcast within 24 hours.

Emergency notification call Registration is required in advance.

It is a service that the City sends information about evacuation by phone or e-mail to people in the area where there is a risk of tsunami, inundation damage, and landslide disaster.

Public relations vehicle

The vehicle will go to the area where danger is predicted, and communicate information by calling from loudspeakers.
