
What is the pattern on the lobby floor?

The pattern on the floor indicates the location of the remains of a residence dating to between the end of the fifth and seventh centuries that was discovered during the construction of the Shinagawa Historical Museum. The square portion represents the extent of the dwelling, and the round portion represents the location of the oven.

The ruins found in this area, including this residence, are known as the Oikashima Archaeological Site. A reconstruction of this residence can be found in the museum garden.
