



Dozo Sagami Inn	
<p>The outside walls of the Sagami Inn have a lattice pattern of white and black, known as “Namako walls”, and were widely seen in the storehouses of the period. This led to Sagami Inn being called “Dozo Sagami” or “Warehouse Sagami” due to its appearance. In 1862, during the late Edo Period, Dozo Sagami was the inn where Takasugi Shinsaku and his accomplices from the Choshu Domain (the present-day area around Hagi City, Yamaguchi Prefecture), gathered before attacking the British Embassy that was soon to be completed at Gotenyama. The Dozo Sagami Inn was the site of many historical incidents, such as an attack in 1866 by people who were destitute.</p>
